Fused Quilt

You will base your quilt on a photograph of a building or neighborhood. Decide how large you want your quilt to be then increase your photograph to that size.

I recommend Rapid Resizer – price ranges from \$39 - \$119 per year. It has a lot of features I use for other things so I have the Pro Version.

Choose fabrics for your main building(s) and sky. I like to use gradients for my buildings but you may use prints, hand dyes or batiks. Choose some colorful fabrics for your windows and doors, awnings, roof

For this quilt you will not need to resize your image. Just choose fabrics as in the above instructions. Try to find colorful fabrics for your windows but make up a cohesive palette.
